



RxPATROL® is the first national information clearinghouse and database for pharmacy crime. It was created in May 2003 as a collaborative effort between industry and law enforcement designed to collect, collate, analyze and disseminate information that can assist law enforcement investigations of pharmacy crimes. By analyzing and reporting on pharmacy crime trends, RxPATROL can also help pharmacy owners take steps to protect their businesses from theft.

RxPATROL disseminates information about unique pharmacy crime incidents, including streaming video and closed circuit television photos of suspects, when available. RxPATROL alerts local law enforcement agencies to incidents within their municipality and neighboring communities so that they can assess potential crime trends and patterns. Investigators also receive contact information for peer law enforcement personnel so they can communicate and collaborate on their investigations. This level of collaboration has helped to apprehend suspects who have committed pharmacy crimes in neighboring towns. In 2005, RxPATROL began partnering with local Crime Stoppers chapters and other community anti-crime programs to offer rewards for information leading to arrests for pharmacy crime. Through this partnership, RxPATROL has been credited with aiding in **57** arrests to date.

Using a sophisticated software program, RxPATROL conducts crime trend analysis and vulnerability assessments for the pharmacy community. These reports offer guidance on how to minimize the risk of theft-related crime. The goal is to make pharmacies safer for pharmacists and for patients with legitimate need for medicines that may be the target of criminals.

## **STATISTICS**

- To date, RxPATROL is credited with 57 arrests for pharmacy crimes.
- There are more than **3,524** documented cases of pharmacy crime in the database, including:

- Over 2,500 drug diversion investigators receive daily RxPATROL pharmacy crime alerts.
- More than 500 law enforcement officers have utilized the database.
- In 2006, RxPATROL offered 74 rewards through local Crime Stoppers and similar community anti-crime programs in 27 states and 68 cities throughout the US and assisted in 12 arrests.
- Through the first ten months of 2007, RxPATROL has offered 117 rewards through Crime Stoppers programs in 30 states and 93 cities throughout the US and has assisted in 31 arrests.

RxPATROL was created and is funded by Purdue Pharma L.P. The program is operated by Captain Richard Conklin, a 27-year veteran of the Stamford, CT Police Department. Captain Conklin is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and a nationally recognized law enforcement consultant. **Crime Stoppers** – A decentralized network of community anti-crime programs working in partnership with the media to provide crime-solving assistance to law enforcement. A cash reward is usually offered to anonymous persons who telephone the Crime Stoppers hot line with information which leads to the arrest of the person(s) responsible for felony offenses (e.g., pharmacy crimes).
