

California Transparency in Supply Chains Act Disclosure

This disclosure applies to Purdue Holdings, Purdue Pharma L.P. and the U.S. Associated Companies (“Purdue”) that may be subject to this disclosure.

Purdue has a published standard expressly on human trafficking and slavery. Purdue communicates this Purdue standard to most relevant suppliers. Purdue does not conduct audits against this Purdue standard.

Purdue does not review suppliers to evaluate and address the risks of whether human trafficking and slavery, as defined by law in each jurisdiction where the supplier operates, is present or is at risk of being present. Since Purdue does not conduct such review Purdue also hereby states that Purdue do not employ a third party auditor or evaluator.

Purdue complies with federal regulations applicable to Purdue as a government contractor to advise relevant suppliers regarding the applicable laws against human trafficking. Purdue does not require suppliers to provide a certification in writing that the materials incorporated into Purdue’s products comply with the laws addressing human trafficking and slavery of the country or countries in which they are doing business, outside of certain federal requirements.

Purdue maintains internal accountability standards and procedures for employees and contractors on a range of topics, including a procedure for anonymous reporting of suspected violations of law or for the reporting of circumstances where the employee believes another employee or a person with whom Purdue is doing business has not met Purdue standards including such standards that all Purdue personnel adhere to applicable laws, including those regarding slavery and trafficking.

Purdue does not provide Purdue employees and management who have direct responsibility for supply chain management training expressly on laws in the countries where Purdue and our suppliers operate on the topics of slavery and human trafficking.
